Pale gold with green hints. The entry is soft and round. It ends with a clean lingering finish.

Chablis, Chardonnay, Domaine William Fèvre, Burgundy, 2018

Fresh and supple, the wine is marked by mineral notes that are typical of the appellation.

8 to 10 months in French oak. Intense bouquet of fruit and flowers. With a delicate mineral hint.

Lush, with a honeyed edge to the mix of pear. While a light thread of acacia adds nuance.

Ripe and juicy, with a mix of apricot, nectarine, melon and pear flavors.

Reveals an anise hint through the finish.

Pommard, Pinot Noir, Bouchard Père & Fils, Burgundy, 2016 28 138

A dense, chunky style, this evokes cherry, strawberry, earth and iron flavors. Tightens up on the compact finish, with a crisp, almost citrusy feel.

Châteauneuf-du-Pape Rouge, Grenache-Syrah, Clos Saint Jean, Rhone, 2016 29 136

This has a dark tea frame around lightly steeped cherry and raspberry fruit notes. Light garrigue and humus hints underscore the finish.

Brunello di Montalcino DOCG, Sangiovese, Casanova di Neri, Tuscany Italy, 2015 27 125

Aromas of ripe blackberries and dark cherries which come together with toast, spices, hazelnut with hints of spring floral and leather.

Bordeaux, Saint – Emilion Grand Cru Classe, Merlot-Cabernet Franc-Cabernet Sauvignon, Château Faugères, 2015 34 164

Beautiful aromas and flavors of warm fig and boysenberry. The finish ripples with fruit and fresh acidity.

Wine Spectator Number 1 Wine of 2019

Bordeaux, St Julien, Cabernet Sauvignon-Merlot, Château Léoville Barton, 2016 75 375

This is so vivid as it brims with pastis-soaked plum, blackberry, black currant and blueberry paste flavors, all carried by a perfectly integrated brambly spine. Tar and ganache notes give the finish an extra kick while everything stays within the mouthwatering roasted apple wood frame.
